



## Mid-season waxflower with large pink blooms for a vibrant floral display

- Choir Girl is a rounded shrub with waxy flowers.
- Flowers from mid spring, with masses of pink flowers with a yellow centre which slowly matures into a dark crimson red.
- Popular as a landscaping variety and for cut flower production.
- It attracts native birds and pollinators.
- Will tolerate a range of free-draining soils, and thrives in full sun or semi-shade.



Description	Evergreen shrub with showy flowers
Density	1 plant per 2m <sup>2</sup>
Height & Width	1.5m x 1.5m
Flowering	October, November
Best Planting Time	March to November
Uses	In borders, native gardens, and low maintenance plantings, and in cut flower production
Position	Full sun to part shade Tolerant of light frost
Soil Type	Well drained soils
Care	Water first 9 weeks until established; Tolerates dry periods once established; Prune up to 1/3 of the plant after flowering; Apply native slow-release fertiliser in early spring
Where it Works	NSW, QLD, SA, TAS, VIC, WA
