



Native waxflower with pink blooms in spikes

- Pinnacle Pink is a rounded shrub with waxy flowers growing in spikes.
- Masses of red buds in winter are followed by beautiful pink flowers in mid- to late spring.
- It attracts native birds and pollinators.
- Will tolerate a range of free-draining soils, and thrives in full sun or semi-shade.



Description	Evergreen shrub with showy flowers
Density	1 plant per m ²
Height & Width	2m x 1.5m
Flowering	November, December
Best Planting Time	March to November
Uses	Mass or accent planting for borders, native gardens, and low maintenance plantings
Position	Full sun to part shade Tolerant of light frost
Soil Type	Well drained soils
Care	Water first 9 weeks until established; Tolerates dry periods once established; Prune up to 1/3 of the plant after flowering; Apply native slow-release fertiliser in early spring
Where it Works	NSW, QLD, SA, TAS, VIC, WA
