



**Masses of mid season white waxflowers on a compact native shrub with fine foliage**

- Tiny Dancer is a compact, rounded shrub with waxy flowers.
- Masses of white blooms flower in mid spring against a backdrop of fresh, fine green foliage.
- It attracts native birds and pollinators.
- Will tolerate a range of free-draining soils, and thrives in full sun or semi-shade.
